Why Tropical North Queensland?

The opportunity to position Tropical North Queensland as a world class mountain bike destination has already been identified. The TNQ Regional Economic plan, the TNQ Repositioning Report, the Tropical North Queensland Tourism Opportunity Plan and experience development workshops undertaken as part of the National Landscapes designation for the Wet Tropics have all identified the opportunity for the region.

Creating a world class mountain bike destination in Tropical North Queensland supports the growth, diversification and dispersal of the tourism dollar in the region and helps to build resilience and capture new high yielding markets from across the globe.

In short, Mountain Biking supports the active contemporary presentation of our extensive and unique natural areas and values, whilst securing meaningful economic and social outcomes for the tourism sector and our local communities.

Our Competitive Advantage

We have an amazing variety of trails and we are uniquely positioned as the world's only rainforest Mountain Bike destination. With some of the worlds most highly regarded Mountain Bike trail designers, we have the potential to develop the world's most sustainable tracks and trails. Of course, mountain biking is not new to our region - we are "known" globally to the MTB tribe and have real trail 'heritage'. In fact, Cairns hosted the 1996 World Downhill Mountain Bike championship. Underpinning participation in mountain biking is a strong existing events calendar, with huge potential for further growth.

Where have we come from?

Grass route development of trails and the active participation and commitment of local clubs underpins the opportunity.

- Cairns MTB Club: Founded 1980's. Produced many elite riders on world circuit. Bought 1996 world champs to TNQ. Home base is the Smithfield MTB Park. 30-40km cross-country plus downhill tracks.
- Tableland Cycle Sports: Incorporated Club operating through Qld Cycling and Mountain Bike Australia. Integrated with TIMBa. 3 years of work developing integrated tracks and trails network across Tablelands. Some funding support already secured from State Govt.
- Mareeba Mountain Goats: 2 years history. Established excellent track at Davies creek 18km trails. Work with other clubs to deliver regional MTB events.

Cairns and the TNQ region has a critical mass of cycle sports and adventure trail orientated retail outlets who are currently servicing a strong local industry and expanding to service visitors. The region has excellent accommodation and transport networks for tourism looking at diversity opportunities.

The economic value of Mountain Biking

For Tropical North Queensland, mountain biking provides an opportunity for year round visitation and supports strong regional dispersal and expenditure. Mountain biking is the fastest growing participation sport globally and a significant travel motivator in high yielding markets. Mountain biking is a virtually "shock proof" tourism segment and a very resilient market, delivering excellent community benefits.

The value of mountain biking is not in doubt. Examples from Australia and around the world support the commitment to developing Tropical North Oueensland as a world-class mountain bike destination.

- Attracts more than 100,000 mountain biking visitors per season
- Summer expenditure in 2006 totaled \$16.2 million
- Summer visitation now exceeds winter visitation with mountain biking the main summer activity

Unlocking the Potential across the region

The region has everything that the Mountain Bike Tourist could ever want, all contained in close proximity to the Cairns arrival hub. The vision for developing mountain biking in the region would be staged development and marketing of 4 key precincts as follows;

- The Downhill Adrenalin Precinct: Smithfield MTB Park, Kuranda trails and the Barron Gorge corridor. Existing world class tracks for all levels, huge growth potential for Skyrail and Kuranda Scenic Rail as access providers, world class rainforest environment and potential event HQ. Tourist ready precinct.
- The Single Track Touring Precinct: The Tablelands network of trails linking Kuranda, Atherton, Mareeba, Malanda, Herberton. Rural, Rainforest, rail trails and linked accommodation services. Mixture of existing and development trails, with future links to coastal areas. Single track touring is highly sought after and high yield visitor profile including family market.



- The Accessible Family Precinct: A new concept to significantly develop the Mt Whitfield area with variety of level trails in the heart of the Cairns hub. Surrounded on all sides by tourism and community infrastructure, the precinct offers immediate access to tracks and trails.
- The Adventure Precinct: Port Douglas and Daintree region, Mission Beach region and further afield into the Gulf Savannah and Cape regions. The entire Tropical North features more intrepid adventures such as the iconic bump track; Weatherby station, Mt Mulligan or scenic beach rides along the Coral Sea coastline.

Next steps

- Reinstate the "World Cup" Downhill track and precinct access, signage
 and facilities at Smithfield in sync with supporting a state bid to host
 Nationals, World Cup and eventually World Championships within the
 TNQ region. Strong interest exists from adjacent James Cook University
 with potential JV partnership at this facility. Develop this site as world
 class Bike Park.
- Develop integrated network of tracks and trails throughout the Tablelands
 Precinct in partnership with council, Queensland Parks and Wildlife
 Service and landowners. Support services and signage. Support the
 education and development of community and industry to be MTB
 friendly.
- Develop the entire Mt Whitfield precinct as a world best practice greenfield project for MTB, supplementing existing tracks and trails.
- Drive training and skilling outcomes in partnership with indigenous employment agencies. Signage. Site well service by existing community. Economic benefit creation opportunities for existing industry.
- Develop a detailed prospectus document outlining the MTB tourism opportunity, which would draw on existing work and would require further economic assessment.
- Integrate MTB tourism and events opportunity into core business of all related agencies.

The approach to ongoing development fits with a longer-term regional vision. The key opportunity that exists is to invest in the immediate term in trail development for those areas where detailed track identification and design has commenced these are 'shovel ready'.
