- Accounting for Nature accreditation underway (this will stream line future implementation by making the CC scheme compatible with the national standard provided by AFN)
- Report to DES on the COP 15 conversations provided fyi (see item 8.4 or more detail)

8.1 National Deer Management Plan – Annelise Weibkin, via Teams (10:30)	
 Introductions – national deer management coordinator – national feral deer management plan – out now for consultation Building coordination across agents and actors to get more deer management in place – deer coordination role one of four national coordinator roles Social media awareness campaign – 6 week trial in 4 separate localities Discussion regarding target area for feral deer (rusa) campaign. Agreement from committee to proceed with the proviso the target area excludes sub region at Cairns' request

The RLP bid will cover off on 5 themes derived from national threatened species action plan. Seeking feedback on concepts for the EOI. These will be circulated postmeeting for comment. If successful they will be further refined through a co-design process.

8.4 UN Biodiversity Conference – (COP15) Report – Terrain NRM (for noting)	

Sarah provided a report on the COP15. DES funded 2 Terrain NRM delegates to attend and report back to the state. Key points

- 12,000 people attendance
- Biological diversity convention
- Global Biodiversity Targets agreed to under the Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF)

The newly adopted framework will now set the global biodiversity action agenda for the next decade, including:

- halt extinction of known threatened species and significantly reduce extinction risk (Goal A)
- ensure at least 30 per cent of areas of degraded terrestrial, inland water, and coastal and marine ecosystems are under effective restoration (Target 2)
- ensure at least 30 per cent of terrestrial, inland water, and of coastal and marine areas are effectively conserved and managed (Target 3)
- reduce the rates of introduction and establishment of other known or potential invasive alien species by at least 50 per cent, by 2030 (Target 6)
- reduce pollution risks and impacts of pollution from all sources to prevent harmful impacts on biodiversity (Target 7)
- minimise the impact of climate change and ocean acidification on biodiversity (Target 8)
- mainstream biodiversity into decision-making across government and business (Targets 14 and 15)
